#### D. Insight Vision and Mission Statement Discussion

The Insight vision and mission statement has gone through proposed changes based on the feedback from the board. The board would like to see the words prepared academically in the mission statement. Ms. McFann will circulate the vision and mission with the proposed changes for one final review.

### E. Suspension and Expulsion Initial Review

The suspension and expulsion letters are aligned to the disciplinary actions outlined in the Student Code of Conduct. The letters have been vetted through legal to ensure that the steps outlined are in compliance to state code. The board questioned if K12 could have provided the template for the letters. Ms. Roth stated that because each state is unique and different.

#### F. Insperity Insurance and Benefits Initial Review

The finance committee was presented with the renewal costs during and the board has those documents available to them in Dropbox. Ms. Coe and Ms. McFann are still working with Insperity to gather additional pieces of information. There is another package option to consider, in addition to the prices for the current package. The finance committee recommended that the HR committee meet prior to the November board meeting to discuss package options. The HR committee members are George Giltner and Michelle Study-Campbell.

#### G. Insight Renewal Update

The onsite visit for the Ball State reauthorization visit along with the AdvancED accreditation team has been postponed to December 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, and 13<sup>th</sup>. The reason for the new dates is that Ball State wants to ensure that there are four members who have online experience. Ball State is pleased with the documents that have been submitted.

#### II. Hoosier Academy, Financial, Legal, and School Operations

#### A. Financial Report, Enrico Rudolph

Mr. Rudolph reviewed the financials for September. The forecasted revenue has a decrease for Indy of \$236k due to low enrollment and an increase of \$109k in Title I funding. There was an increase in overall school expenditures. The most notable are \$21k for general liability insurance; \$95k decrease in K12 invoices; and \$102k increase will go to personnel expenses mostly due to the increase in Title I funding. There will likely be interventionists hired for math and English at Insight. K12 charges, such as technology services, educational services, oversight/sponsor fees, and instruction fees, are aligned to enrollment. General liability insurance went up for \$21k because virtual carried the cost, but the insurance belongs to hybrid. We realigned so that hybrid is carrying the cost. There was an overall increase in cash balance of \$48k; inflow if state aid for FY19 enrollment projection and restricted fundings. Outflows consist of payroll, K12, and other items.

Last month the board asked that we look into student teacher ratios to potentially hire a math and English teacher, and Mr. Rudolph stated that we plan to hire interventionists because after analyzing the data, and identifying additional Title I funds, we could not justify hiring teachers. The interventionist will help alleviate some of the workload for the math and English teachers. The student teacher ratios will not go down, but it will help with small group and MindPlay time. An interventionist cannot teach a core content class, and they will be a licensed teacher qualified to teacher math and English. The board is Mr. Rudolph stated that we budgeted for 17 teachers and there are currently 18 without interventionist. The board asked how it is possible to have such high student teacher ratios if we have 18 teachers. Mr. Rudolph explained that the budget is assumptions and we assumed when working on the budget in April/May, using current numbers, that a student has an average of four courses, and the teacher ratios were 1:175. Back then, the numbers were correct. We are still in discussion and looking at a long-term solution. We currently have three job postings posted with Insperity and working on posting for a SpEd. When we hire those positions, that will not have an impact because these are backfill positions. The board asked what we can do to work with K12 to get these ratios to what you see in a traditional brick-nmortar. Ms. Roth and Mr. Rudolph replied that going back to the drawing board and identifying what is normal for Insight, what are the best ratios to meet the needs of students. The board stated that we cannot wait on this and fears that second semester is too late. Ms. Roth will continue to look and work on this topic.

Mr. Meyer motioned to accept the September financials subject for review and audit. Mr. Boler seconded. ROLL CALL: Mr. Boler, yes; Mr. Marske, yes; Mr. Meyer, yes; and Mr. Giltner, yes. The motion passed.

Mr. Rudolph reviewed the September vouchers. There are some virtual vouchers dealing with closed grants, and the school is still receiving notification from parents saying IPS checks were lost or never received so the school has to void out original and send a new one.

Mr. Meyer stated that the finance committee to review the vouchers and found nothing unusual and motioned to accept the September 2018 vouchers for Insight and Indy for audit. Ms. Study-Campbell seconded. ROLL CALL: Mr. Boler, yes; Mr. Marske, yes; Mr. Meyer, yes; and Mr. Giltner, yes. The motion passed.

Ms. Coe informed the board of PRF, which is the state retirement for non-teaching positions. Currently we offer TRF and a 403b, but we are going to offer PDF so that non-teaching staff can participate. There would be no additional financial impact. We are looking at mirroring what we offer for TRF; the employer contributes 7.5% and the employee contributes 3%. This is to allow staff members who have moved from a teaching position to a non-teaching position to keep their vested time. Mr. Rudolph stated that this does not have an impact on the budget. Staff members will not be able to participate in two retirement options. Ms. Coe is working with legal counsel on the resolution and the required documents.

#### D. Enrollment Report, Kathy Coe

Total enrollment for the 18-19 school year at Hoosier Indy is 193, which is up from last month at 189. Insight is at 767, which is down from last month at 809. The total HANS enrollment is 960. No shows and truancy are the reasons for declines.

We have a master data tracker where we can put all school in one place. I will add to this weekly to continue to seek trends.

We are looking at tracker data together. Teachers are justifying progress rates, especially when something stands out. For instance, teachers with high progress percentages are asked to share what their approach is, and teachers with low progress are asked why they think their rates are low.

Teachers are asked to share data in bi-weekly data meetings on standards-based data.

Teachers held parent-teacher conferences the week before fall break, getting "on the same page" with current student course progress, class attendance, and supplemental program data (Mindplay and Ascend).

### K-6 Hybrid Outcome



We have a school culture where sharing is encouraged and highlighted. As teachers are encouraged to share good ideas, they are inspired to try new things and see improvements in their own data.

We are seeing continued growth in Mindplay and Ascend.

Class connect attendance remains steady and high, with attendance percentages ranging from the mid 80's to the mid 90's. Kindergarten got 100% attendance for

the week prior 10.8.18.

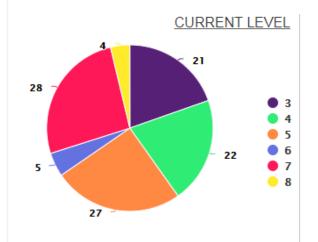

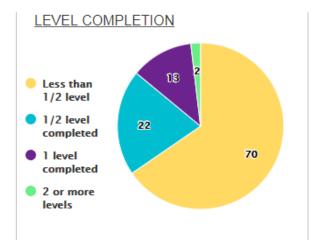

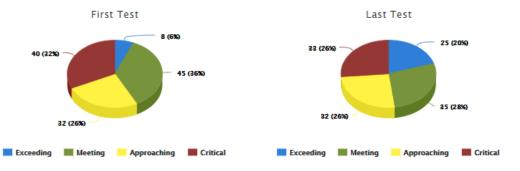

The pie graphs represent the first and last test for each student given between 8/6/2018 - 10/23/2018

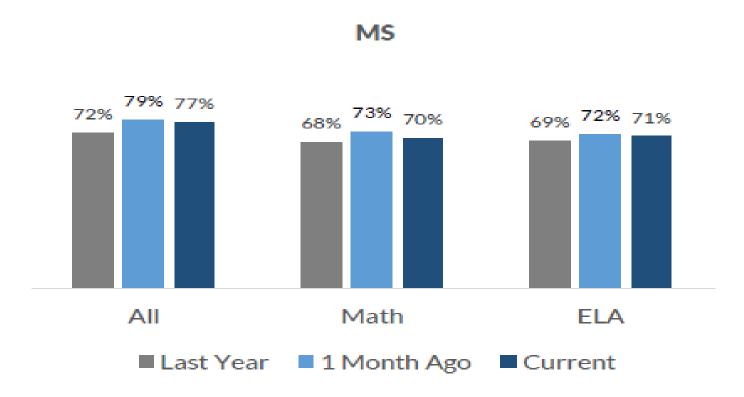
#### Average Grade Level Improvement

We are setting up data chats with students where they must seek and share their grades and information in Mindplay and Ascend. They must also set goals.

We are incorporating our advisor on certain days in class to help targeted students master assessments they have failed.

Teacher are encouraged to attend community events to increase culture/community (Manufacturing Day).

### 7-8 Insight, Outcome



We have seen increases in the number of students passing courses specifically due to our targeted make-up sessions with failing students.

Students are more aware of their grades and expectations.

BBC rates continue to hold strong.

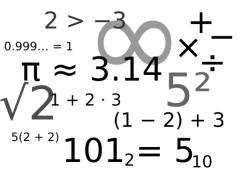

<u>10.3.18 - Sped BBC Attendance</u>. How is it working for the teachers. Do have positive feedback this year. 18 year old's that are not engaged. Making calls and next steps with FAST for this Attendance as they are bringing down our attendance. They are not bound for compulsory attendance/engagement.

10.10.18 Approximately 40 (25%), with 21 students 18+ or older who are not bound by compulsory attendance. SE students are in Tier 3 for attendance/engagement. Current SE population at Insight is 158 students (20% of total population). For grades 9-12, 72% of SE students are failing 1 or more courses.

10.22.18 Indy HS students are not attending BBC during virtual days. ELA pass rates for SE are 57.1% compared to overall pass rates of 62.8% with Math at 46.2% compared to 66.1% overall.

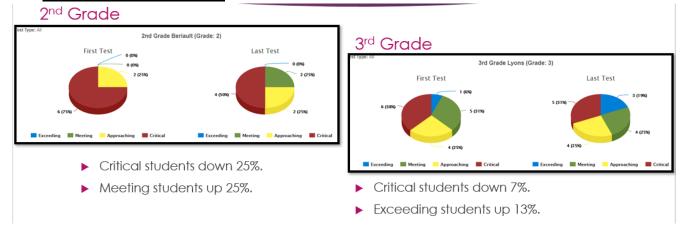

Questions, Summary and Outcomes

Data Collected 10-1-18, 10-8,18, 10-15-18:

What action could be taken to improve our % of students with Back on Track (BOT) plans?

FASL's have not been marking the FAST referrals for all BOT plans. They also having been creating BOT plans for ALL referrals. They will begin creating BOT's for all referrals on their caseload. One obstacle is the approval process. Staggering approvals, rathering doing them in batches will help with staggering the due dates and managing the BOT's. OUTCOME: Indy improved from 0 to 60%. ISIN from 9.6 to 34%.

What action could we take to improve the number of students completing their ORN course within 5 days of enrollment? We are two Advisors short, so the remaining five are spreading out the caseload until the positions are filled. They will send reminders in their welcome emails and phone calls. FEC will offer recurring CC session on Monday's to nudge new students to complete course. Indy Counselor will direct students to complete during in person orientation. FEC will provide Advisors with a list of students who have not completed the ORN course, so Advisors can follow up. OUTCOME: Indy improved from 50% to 60%. ISIN from 65% to 79%.

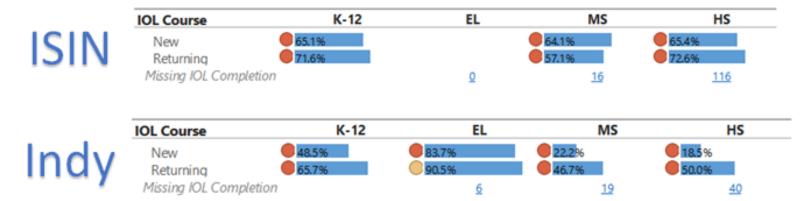

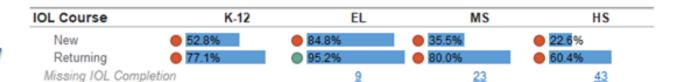

### ORN Course Completed within First 5 Days of School





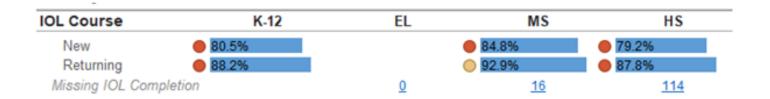
